Robert Service Campground

Trail System

A multipurpose trail system exists within all of the subdivisions along the Yukon River and the Old Airport Road.

The Millennium Trail consists of a 5km loop of paved trail. The trail starts on the east side of the Yukon River in Riverdale, crossing to the west side of the river at the Rotary Centennial Footbridge and looping back to the SS Klondike.

The Yukon River Loop Trail is a 15.5 km circle that takes about 4 to 5 and a half hours to complete. Hiking the loop clockwise, the trailhead starts across from the Fish Ladder, bordering along Schwatka Lake to Miles Canyon. Here the trail crosses to the west side of the Yukon River on the Miles Canyon footbridge, bordering the river back to Robert Service Campground where it connects to the Millennium Trail.
