POLICY: USES OF ROTARY PEACE PARK

PURPOSE: To provide for and identify uses of Rotary Peace Park.

AUTHORITY: Council Resolution # 95-23-32 dated October 23, 1995

USES OF ROTARY PEACE PARK POLICY

Background

The City of Whitehorse is the owner and operator of Rotary Peace Park. In accordance with the terms and conditions of the City of Whitehorse Zoning Bylaw, permitted uses of the Park shall be regulated by Council Policy.

Definitions

1. In this policy,
 - (1) "City" means the municipality of the City of Whitehorse.
 - (2) "Club/Group/Organization" means a non profit association of individuals whose purpose is to provide a service(s) to the community. Registration under the Societies Act is not a requirement.
 - (3) "Concession Services" means the sale of food, beverages and refreshments (other than spirituous, fermented or intoxicating liquids).
 - (4) "Council" means the duly elected council of the City of Whitehorse.
 - (5) "Manager" means the Manager of the Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Whitehorse or his/her duly authorized representative.
 - (6) "Mobile Refreshment Stand" means a booth, stand or vehicle which is designed to be portable and includes a tray or container.
 - (7) "Non Concession Goods and Services" means the sale of non food and beverage items.
 - (8) "Planning Department" means the Planning Department of the City of

Whitehorse.

- (9) "Recreation Department" means the Parks and Recreation Department of the City of Whitehorse.
- (10) "Rotary Peace Park means the area, amenities and structures encompassed in Lot 286 Downtown.

General

- 2. City Council may, by resolution, authorize the inclusion of uses as per the provisions of the Zoning Bylaw.
- 3. The Club/Group/Organization shall:
 - (1) comply with all statutes, regulations and bylaws whether federal, territorial or municipal;
 - (2) be responsible for obtaining all licenses and permits required at his/her expense.

Uses of Rotary Peace Park

- 4. Permitted uses in Rotary Park shall include:
 - (1) As per the definition section of the Zoning Bylaw;
 - (a) Community Events including Carnivals, Festivals and Fairs sponsored by non profit community organizations;
 - (b) Indoor Participant Recreation Services;
 - (c) Outdoor Amphitheatre and Band Shell;
 - (d) Outdoor Participant Recreation Services;
 - (e) Parks and Playgrounds;
 - (f) Temporary Mobile Refreshment Stands.
 - (2) The sale of concession services, non concession goods and services and the operation of Mobile Refreshment Stands shall be as per the Council Policy on Sale of Goods and Services in Rotary Peace Park.

- (3) The consumption and/or serving of Alcoholic Beverages shall be as per the Council Policy on Public Drinking .
5. Applications for use or activities of Rotary Peace Park deemed not to fall within Clause 1, Sub clause (a) shall be referred through normal procedures of the Planning Board and City Council for approval.

Application for Use of Rotary Peace Park

6. For clubs, groups and organizations wanting to book Rotary Peace Park for a Community Event:
 - (1) Applicant completes a Booking Form for use of Rotary Peace Park. Form is processed by Parks and Recreation Department.
 - (2) If tent structure(s) are involved and usage exceeds (7) days, an Application for Development Permit is completed and submitted to the Planning Department.

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
