Located on the banks of the Yukon River. Shipyards Park is the premiere park for festivals and community events.

Trails

The City of Whitehorse has an extensive trail network with an estimated 150 km of designated city trails and at least 700 km of local and neighbourhood trails used by Whitehorse residents.

Here are some popular winter trails:

- Airport Perimeter Trail
- Black Street Stairs
- Chadburn Lake and Magnusson Ski Trails
- Millennium Trail
- Riverfront Trail
- Trans Canada Trail
- Two Mile Hill Bicycle Path (North Side)

Winter Trail Maintenance

The Riverfront Trail from Rotary Peace Park to Spook Creek Station as well as the Millennium Trail are maintained throughout the winter by Parks and Trails.

The City of Whitehorse will continue to partner with the Klondike Snowmobile Association to groom various designated motorized trails and the Whistle Bend perimeter paved trail. These trails are groomed a minimum of twice a month based on weather and snow conditions. Please use caution when using these trails.
