Council members commended the budget, the low tax increase, and the improvements made to the budget process. It was noted that property tax may be a problematic funding source in the long run as it leads to higher housing costs and potentially impacts financially disadvantaged persons. Municipalities across Canada are looking for alternate revenue sources, including the possibility of receiving more revenue from federal and territorial taxation.
