SUBJECT: Public Hearing – Intended Designation of Municipal Historic Sites

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Please be advised there will be a Public Hearing at the Regular Council Meeting of October 14, 2014, to hear from interested parties concerning the following bylaw:

**Bylaw 2014-29, a bylaw to designate the buildings on Lots 11 and 12, Block 24, Plan 3807 LTO, located at 303 Elliott Street, commonly known as the Old Log Church and Rectory, as Municipal Historic Sites.**

Constructed in 1900 and 1901, the Old Log Church and Rectory are two of the oldest buildings in Whitehorse. The buildings are owned by the Diocese of Yukon, Anglican Church of Canada, and are managed by the Yukon Church Heritage Society (YCHS).

Bylaw 2014-29 received 1<sup>st</sup> Reading on July 28, 2014. In accordance with the *Historic Resources Act*, Notice of Intent was served to the owner of the building, the Minister of Tourism and Culture, and the Land Titles Office. Advertisements were included in two newspapers, and were broadcast on radio and television.

The Yukon Government (YG) Heritage Resource Branch simultaneously launched a process to recognize the church and rectory as Historic Sites at the Territorial level. The 30-day public comment period for the YG process ended on August 31<sup>st</sup>; no comments were received. The City's municipal process for designation requires a 60-day public comment period, which will end on the day of the Public Hearing.

Your Worship, the City Operations Committee respectfully submits the following report:

### **1. Compost Operations**

Since 2012 compost operations at the Waste Management Facility have been conducted by Boreal Composting under an operating services agreement. Recent investments in equipment and aeration pads have increased processing capacity at the facility, and it is anticipated that the current levels will increase as the commercial and institutional sectors begin sorting organics from the waste stream. As the current operating agreement expires at the end of October, a public tender was issued for compost operations. Only one bid was received in response to the tender issued, and the bid price was almost 60% higher than existing costs for the first year with substantial increases proposed for the next two years.

Due to the high tender price submitted, administration examined the cost requirements for city resources to assume compost operations. Estimates indicate that city resources could resume operation of the compost facility for less than the bid price received.

Administration confirmed that the bid price was higher than expected, but with a budget allocation internal resources could meet the program requirements. With City staff operating the facility, compost sales would largely occur through the gatehouse, and any marketing efforts would be undertaken only with budget approval from Council.

### **Recommendation**

THAT the tender for 2014–17 compost facility operations be cancelled; and

THAT administration be directed to prepare a budget submission through the normal operational budget process for assuming compost facility operations within the City

## **2. Contract Award – Janitorial Services**

The City contracts out the janitorial services required to maintain a safe, hygienic, and aesthetically pleasing work environment in a variety of City owned facilities. The services are currently supplied under three contracts that expire at the end of October. To obtain better consistency and pricing, the three contracts were combined and a public tender was issued for the supply of janitorial services, including cleaning, waste management, recycling and compost services. Specifications to support Zero Waste and the Strategic Sustainability Plan were included in the tender. Also included were provisions for clear environmental practices in terms of service delivery and the handling of materials. Four bids were received in response to the tender issued, and the low bid reflects the better pricing anticipated by combining the contracts.

### **Recommendation**

THAT the contract for the supply and delivery of janitorial services, including cleaning, waste management, recycling and compost services, be awarded to Tri-Omni Inc. for a net annual cost of \$210,007.00 for a three year term from November 1, 2014 to October 31, 2017

### 1. **Recycling Issues** – For Information Only

Jacqueline Bedard, President of Raven Recycling, provided an update on Raven's efforts to continue providing services to the community in spite of closing their free drop-off service for non-refundable recyclables. She confirmed that Raven is not looking for a bailout but rather for a sustainable long-term solution to the issue. Ms. Bedard cited several reports prepared over the past few years showing the need to find solutions for recycling issues, and urged Council to continue working with Raven Recycling as part of the City's efforts to divert solid waste from the landfill

Joy Snider, Executive Director of Raven Recycling, confirmed that changes to beverage container regulations are not expected for at least a year. She also confirmed that the funds from these regulations only cover a small portion of the costs incurred by recyclers.

Cameron Eckert spoke in support of Raven Recycling. He stated the opinion that Raven has saved a lot of taxpayer funds over the years, and urged Council to work towards both long and short-term solutions to keep Raven viable. Mr. Eckert expressed concern that an interruption of the services currently provided by Raven will cause

people to change their waste diversion habits. He urged Council to implement a quick solution, and stated that as a taxpayer he would be willing to pay for it.

Pavlina Sudrich spoke in support of a curb-side recycling program and encouraged a creative implementation strategy.

## BYLAW 2014-32

A bylaw to rename Mile 926 Old Alaska Highway

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WHEREAS section 265 of the *Municipal Act* (R. S. Y. 2002) provides that Council may by bylaw name a road or subdivision; and

WHEREAS Whitehorse City Council adopted a policy to guide the assignment of names to streets, subdivisions, parks, recreation areas, and city-owned buildings and facilities within the municipal boundaries of the City of Whitehorse; and

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to officially rename the section of Old Alaska Highway located adjacent to Mile 926 Alaska Highway and accessed by Parent Lane in Whitehorse;

NOW THEREFORE the council of the municipality of the City of Whitehorse, in open meeting assembled, hereby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Old Alaska Highway, in the Stevens area of Whitehorse, Yukon Territory is hereby renamed "**McGundy Road**", as indicated on the sketch attached hereto as Appendix "A" and forming part of this bylaw; and
2. This bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon the final passing thereof.

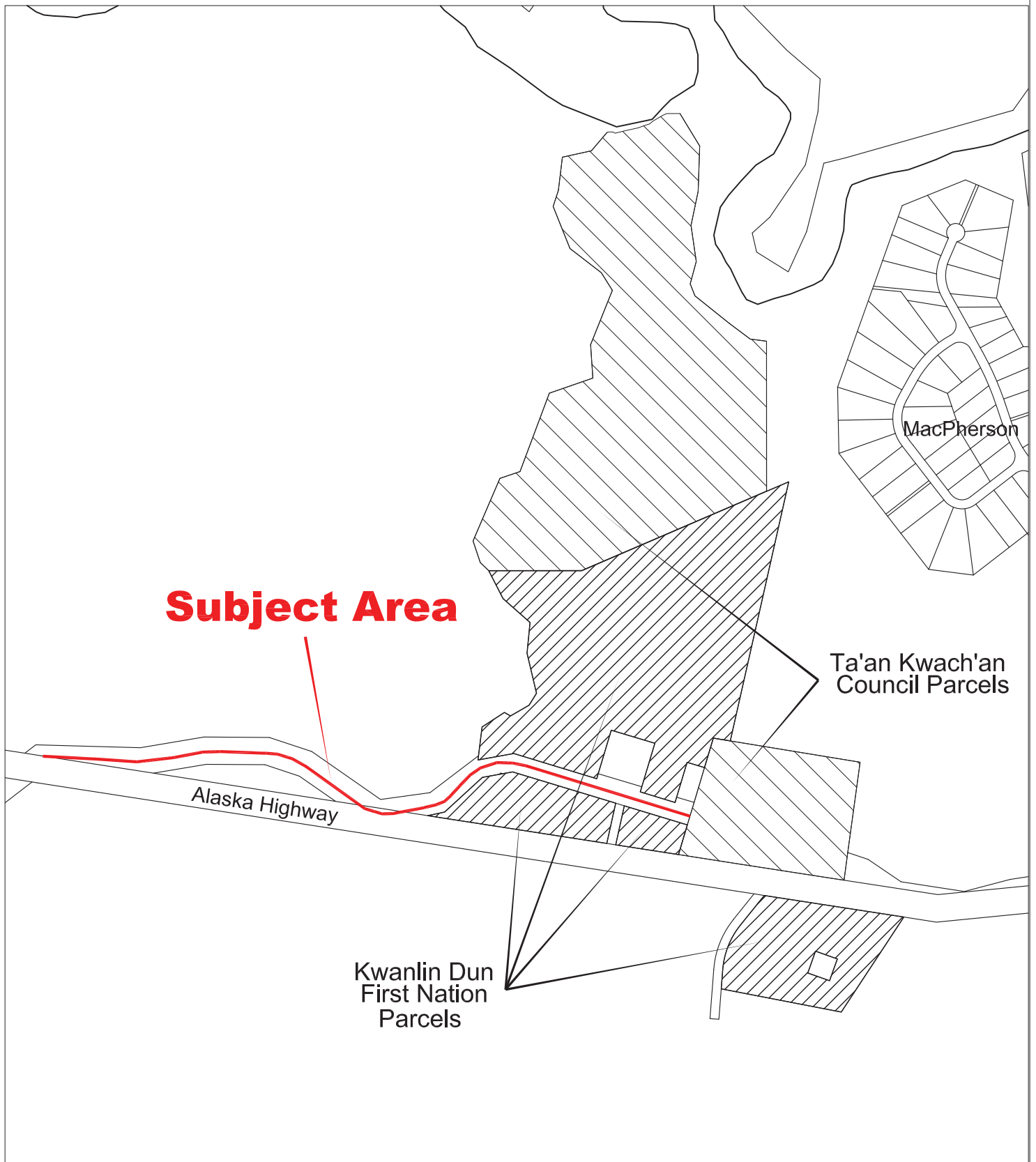
