Bylaw 2024-46, a bylaw to rezone 505, 507, 509, and 511 Main Street, from CC – Core Commercial to CCx – Core Commercial (modified), to reduce the number of required off-street parking spaces.

The City received an application to rezone the site of the future Hyatt Place Hotel, from CC – Core Commercial to CCx – Core Commercial (modified), to reduce the parking requirement from one parking space per 150 m<sup>2</sup> to one parking space per 300 m<sup>2</sup>.






